The annual conference is always a highlight of the year so it was with regret that we had to cancel the 2020 event during lockdown. Having learned a lot from the series of successful cpd25 sessions run virtually during the pandemic, the Steering Group felt that we could run an online conference in 2021: the theme of The Future of Libraries was more relevant than ever and we could offer an opportunity to speak to people who had prepared last year, as well as to colleagues with new experiences to share.

Despite the careful and detailed planning and organisation from the team, to be honest none of us were quite sure how it was going to go-would Zoom work; would anyone attend; would the speakers come across virtually without an audience in the room? I was delighted (and relieved) that on the day over 100 delegates joined the conference for a series of interesting, engaging and challenging presentations, which made good use of the format and went off with almost no technical hitches!

Feedback on the day was very positive-it was felt that use of chat encouraged a wider range of questions and comments; and the online format made attendance much more time-efficient, without all the travelling. There were also useful suggestions for the future including possible use of breakout rooms for networking between sessions. We will bear all of these in mind for future events.

Search25 update and Buddying Scheme

This is a reminder that the Search25 discovery tool will be decommissioned on 31 July 2021. Please make your staff and users aware of this deadline. We are encouraging members who are not already doing so to contribute their bibliographic metadata to the Jisc Library Hub. Following the recent Members' Seminar, we have introduced the 'Buddying Scheme'. Using an institution's Library Management System as the main criteria, we will match those members not yet using Library Hub with an institution that has already made the transition to Library Hub. The 'buddy' institution will offer informal advice, tips, and support where needed. 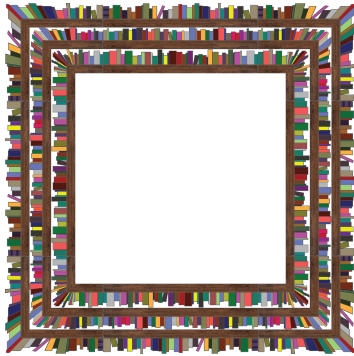
M25 SpeedMeet

M25 Vouchers

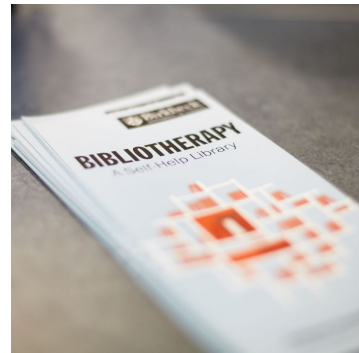
Deadline 31 July 2021
