## cpd25 Task Groups

cpd25 is currently seeking new members to join [Task Group 2](#) and [Task Group 4](#) and to contribute to the development and delivery of our programme on behalf of the M25 Consortium of Academic Libraries.

Membership of Task Groups is open to all staff in M25 member institutions, with Task Group members normally drawn from a cross-section of member

institutions, job roles and levels. We are particularly keen to encourage more representation from our members within scholarly institutions.

Each Task Group meets approximately 3-4 times per year, and there is an annual cpd25 planning event when topics are considered to inform the following academic year's programme planning.

[Task Group 2](#) is a group that provide training and development in areas such as equal opportunities, accessibility, disability, health and safety, copyright and data protection. We always attempt to work on events in pairs or more, so newer members can work alongside those with more experience. Recently we have held events on "Supporting staff and students with autism and learning disorders" which was a repeat event we have run in the past, "The role of prison libraries" and we have had a visit to the Wellcome Library. One of our upcoming events we have organised include "Deaf awareness training with Dot Sign Language which is a repeat of a session we held last year.

[Task Group 4](#) is a small, but very friendly group and we always work on events in pairs or more, so newer members can work alongside those with more experience. We tend to put on some repeat events each year, such as 'Training for supervisors' as they're so popular. We also try out some new events and plan visits. These past few months we've arranged visits to the libraries of the Royal College of Surgeons and London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, as well as a half-day event on 'Your career plan'.
