Event and Visit Attendance 2022-23

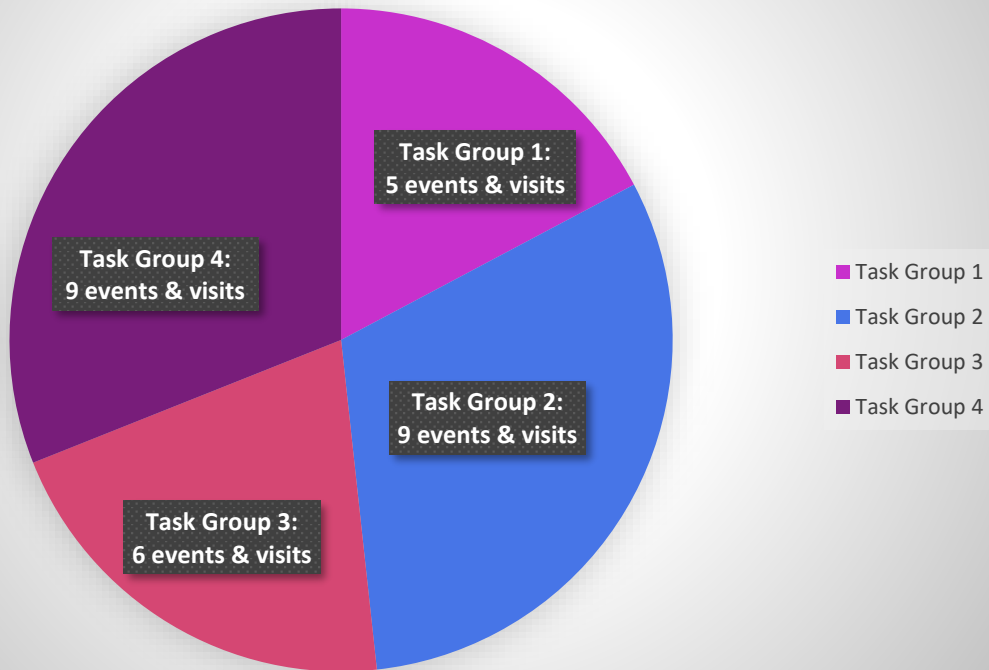

The table below shows a breakdown of all the events that took place, in order of Task Group, including numbers of attendees:

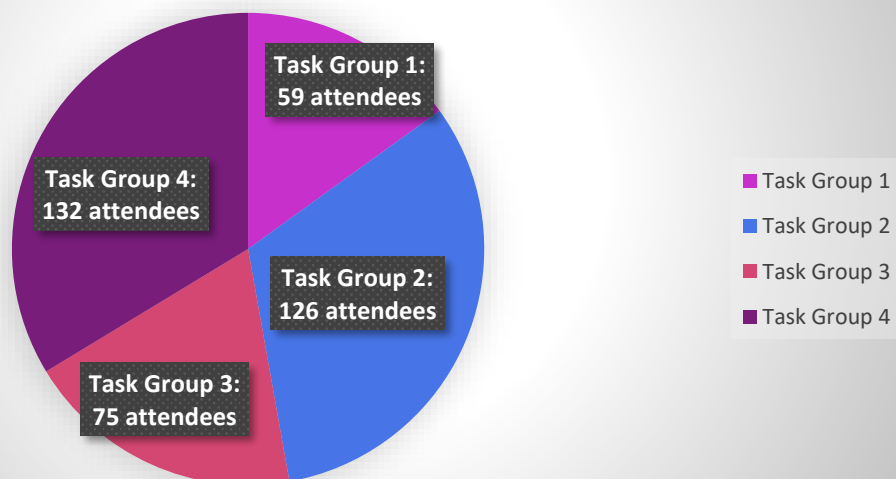

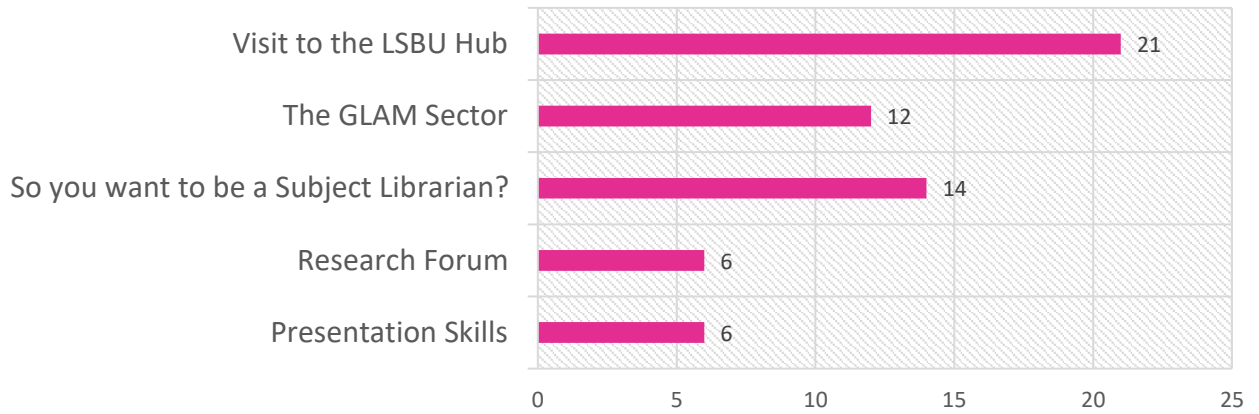

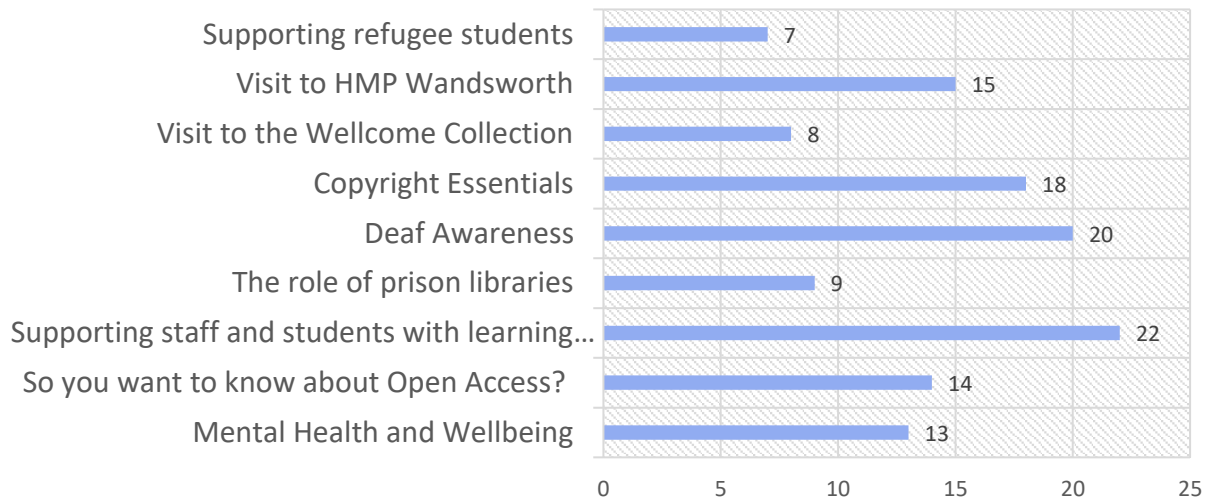
Number of event & visit attendees Total - 392



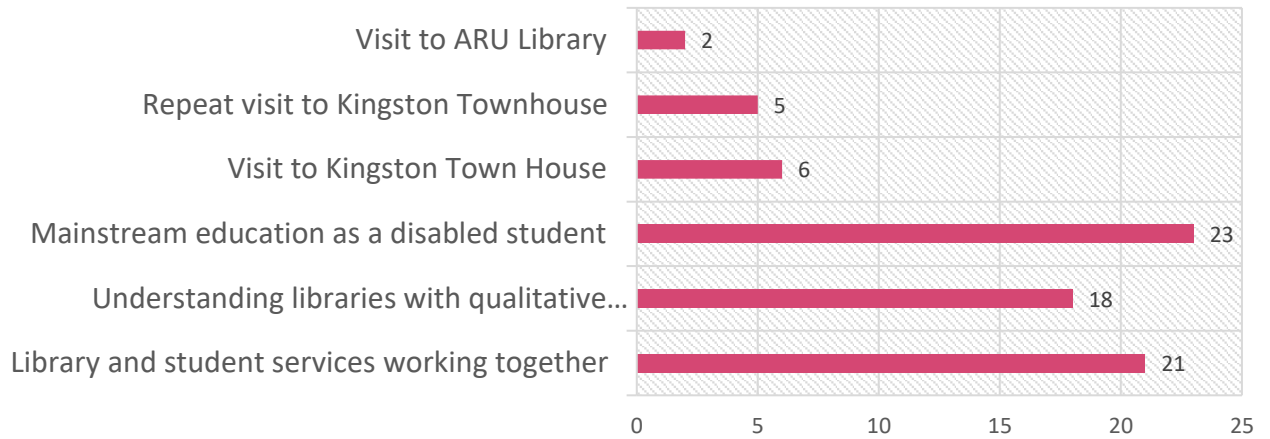
TG1 Attendance Total 59



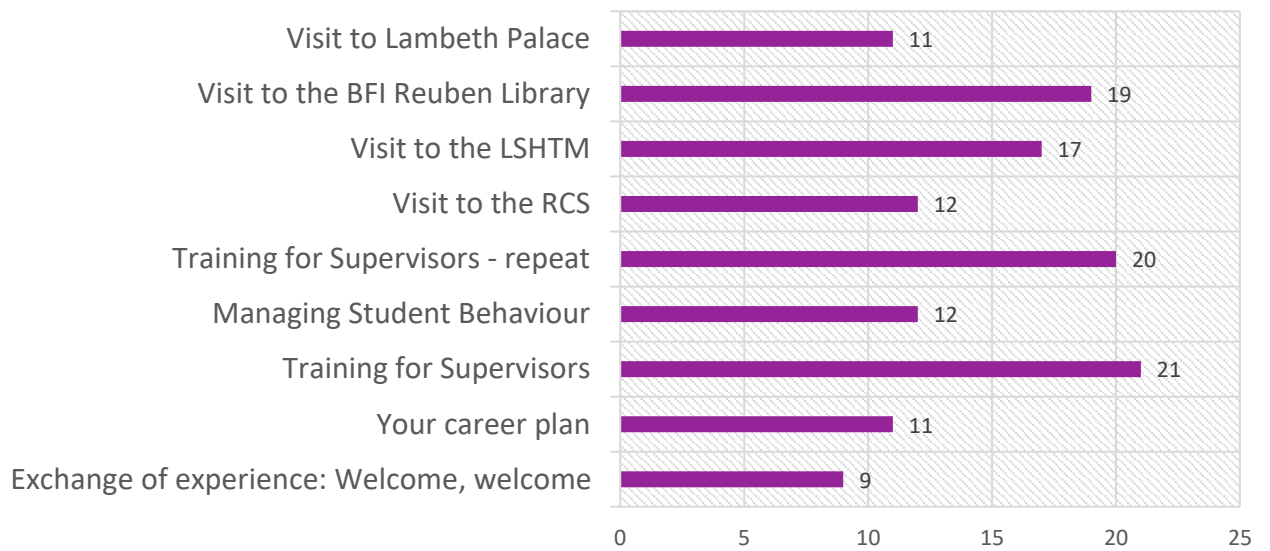
TG2 Attendance Total 126



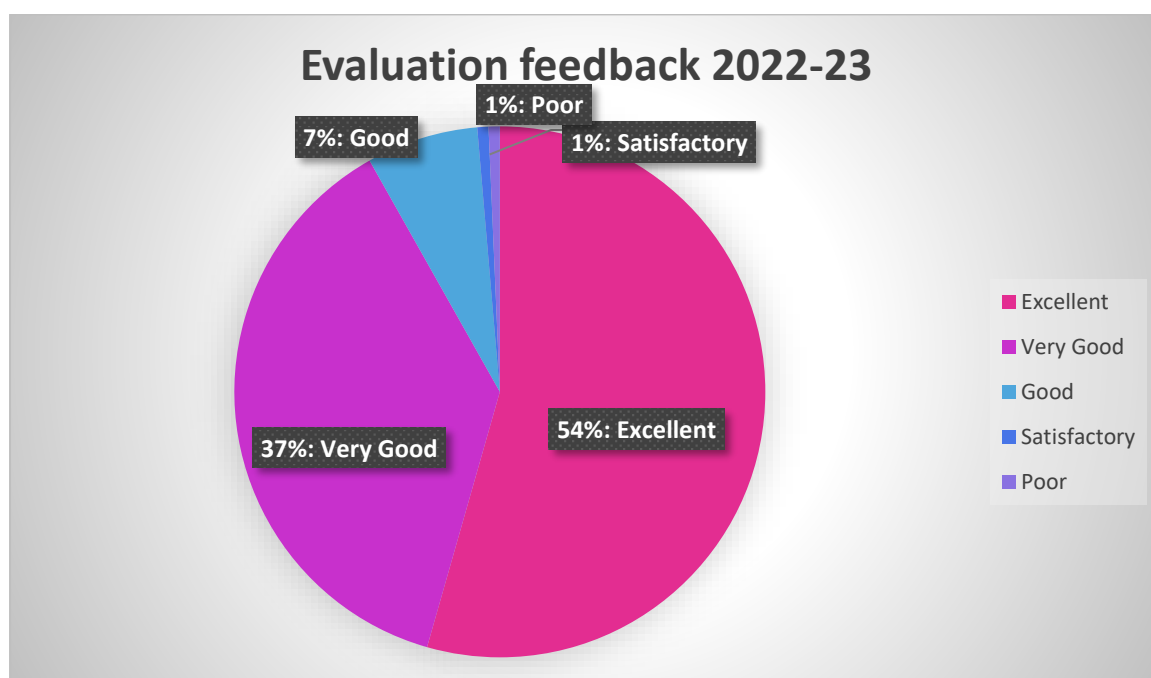
TG3 Attendance Total 75

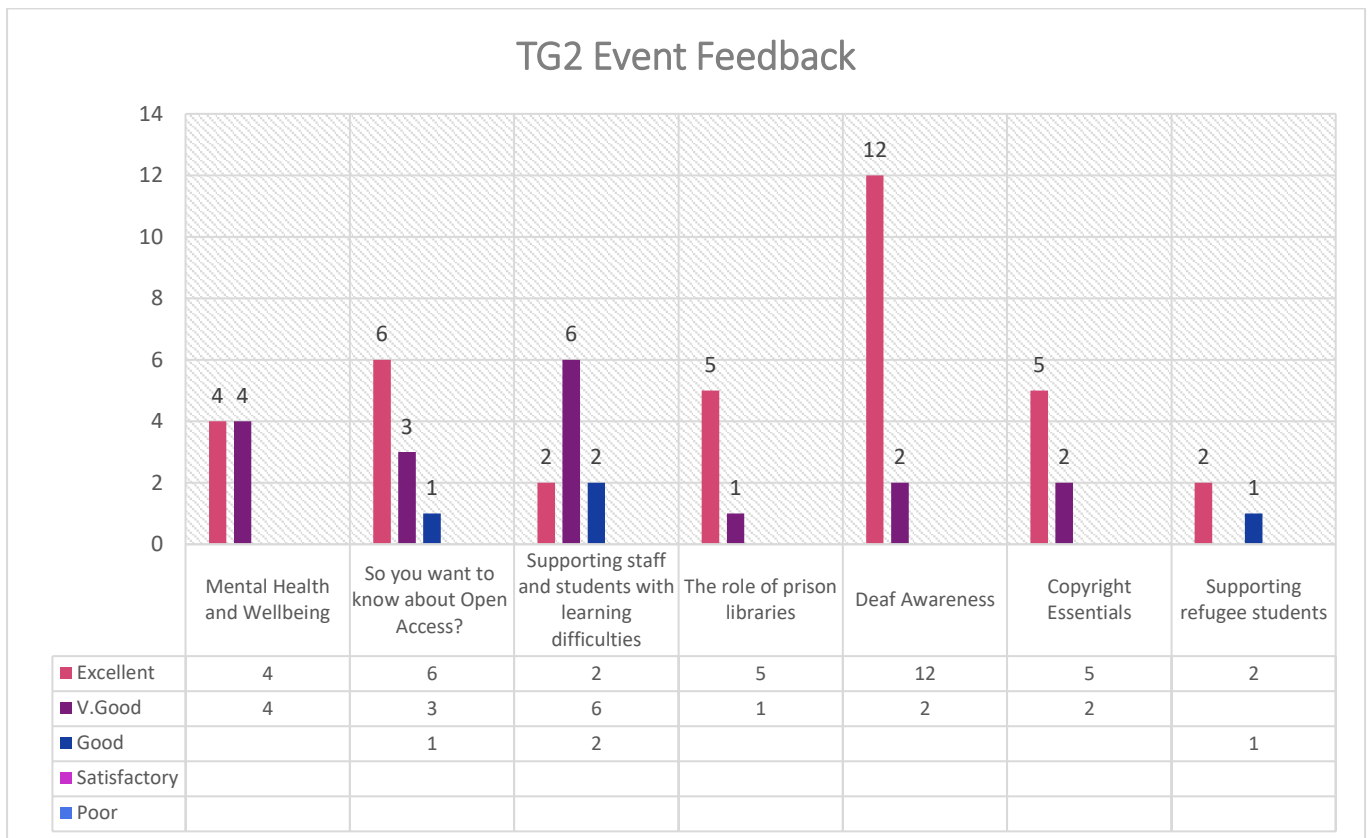
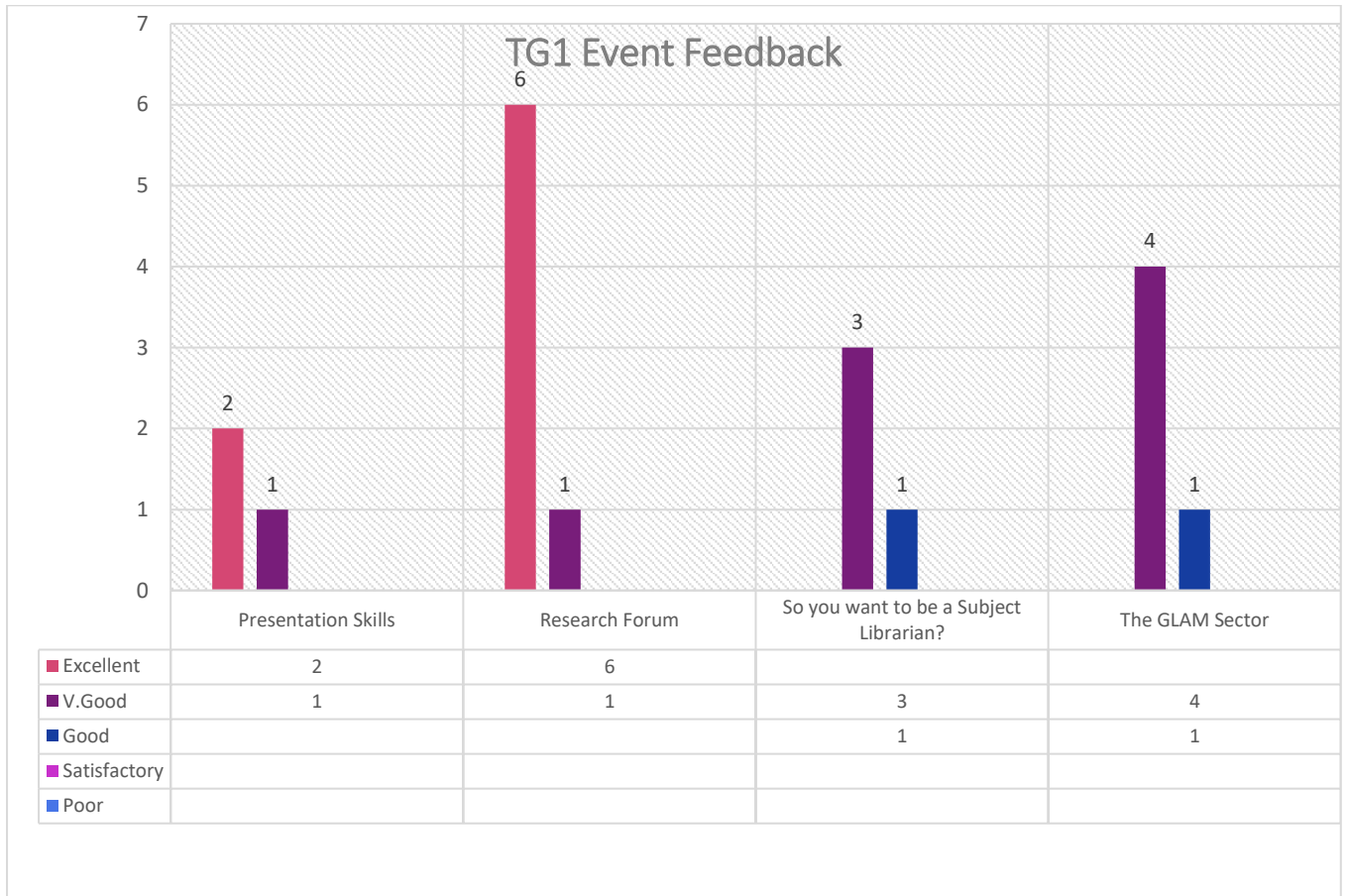

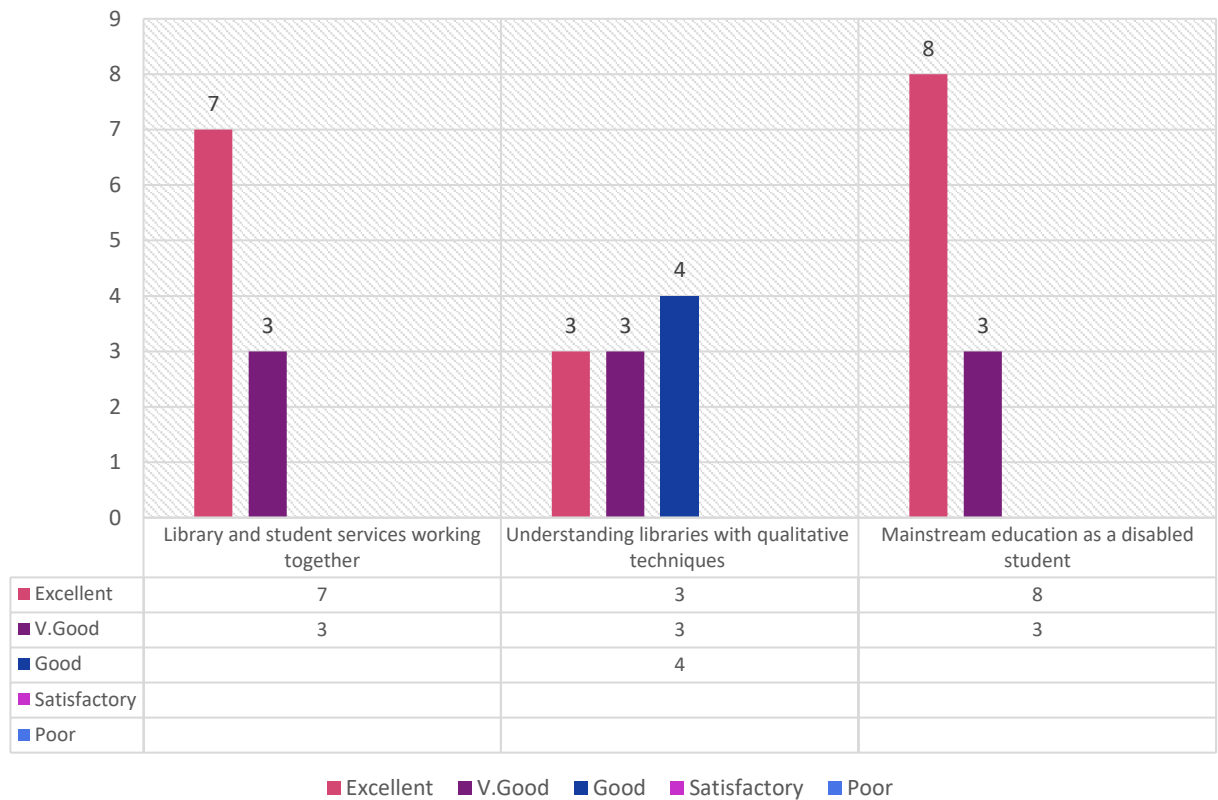
