The Innovation Fund is a competitive award created by the M25 Consortium. Successful applications will receive funding to deliver a project, resource, research or other activity that works towards one or more of the themes in the Consortium's 2023-2026 Strategic Plan for the benefit of Consortium members.

The total amount in the Fund for 2025-26 is £1,000 and applicants can apply for grants from the fund from £100 up £1,000. Any library staff member or



group of staff at one of our member institutions can apply.

Each Task Group meets online approximately three or four times per year, and there is an annual cpd25 planning event when topics are considered to inform the following academic year's programme planning.

Task Group 2, the Workplace Standards and Legal Frameworks group, provides training and development in areas such as equal opportunities, accessibility, disability, health and safety, copyright and data protection.

Task Group 4, the Personal, Management and Business Skills group aims to provide training, networking and staff development opportunities for staff in libraries in areas of generic interest i.e. not specific to library work.
