



Call for Lightning Talk Presentations for M25 Consortium's Annual Conference 2026

1. About M25 Annual Conference 2026

In 2026, the [M25 Consortium's Annual Conference](#) will take place online. We look forward to presenting an excellent online Conference and welcoming everyone virtually on **Tuesday 9^h June 2026**. We are currently putting together the Conference programme and will be starting to announce speakers early in 2026.

2. Conference Theme

Our theme for Conference 2026 is “**Sunshine Through the Rain: celebrating our successes**”

Higher education and scholarly libraries continue to deliver outstanding services for their users during these challenging financial times. We are taking the time at our online Conference to hear from voices across the sector. We will celebrate the wins by sharing achievements, collaborations, staff wellbeing initiatives, projects, and activities that have provided some sunshine through the rain: whether small or large – they all make a difference.

3. Present a Lightning Talk

We are pleased to announce that the call for lightning talk presentations is now open. We are looking for speakers to deliver short, focussed talks that connect to our Conference theme. Has your service worked on an approach that has resonated well with your users? Have you introduced a positive change or activity for staff that has helped them to manage change and challenges? Our aim is to provide delegates with positive stories, inspiration, and ideas to consider in their own institutions, however small.

4. Conference audience

The Conference is usually attended by a wide range of library staff, from library assistants to directors of library services. The type of libraries they represent reflect the diversity of the M25 Consortium membership: there will be Higher Education libraries represented alongside scholarly, national, museum, research, GLAM and special research collection libraries. In submitting your Lightning Talk proposal, please consider the diverse audience you will have.

5. Lightning Talks in the Conference Programme

There will be **four lightning talk slots**: two in the morning and two in the afternoon. These will be short presentations of no more than ten minutes. After each talk, there will be time for managed questions from delegates.

6. Visuals

As the talks are short, there will be limited time for sharing slides to support your presentation. If you do use slides, keep them to a handful and support your talk with key words, visuals, and

graphics. We would prefer your slides to be in PowerPoint format (this is due to the need for consistency in running the technical side of the conference).

7. Conditions

8. What's in it for me?

As well as providing a great professional development opportunity at a highly respected academic library sector event, the four lightning talk speakers will receive a free delegate place to Conference and be featured in an M25 Monthly Newsletter.

9. All voices

We strongly encourage library staff from our member institutions at any level and type of role to apply, particularly if you are new to presenting or have not previously presented at our Annual Conference. Just over a third of our members are smaller libraries. To reflect the broad range of M25 members, we also encourage submissions from those working in smaller or specialist scholarly libraries. We will provide a Conference Presenter buddy for those that would like additional support prior to presenting.

10. How to apply

Send a short summary, of not more than 250 words, outlining the subject of your talk, to the Conference Planning Group to Jill Howard, M25 Consortium Operations Manager M25libadmin@london.ac.uk.

Please submit your summary as a Word file (not in the text body of an email), saved with your surname and 'M25 Conference 2026' in the title. The deadline for submissions is **Friday 27 March 2026**. We may extend the deadline if required. We will select the successful Lightning Talks in March 2026.
